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

The Epilepsy Phenome/Genome Project (EPGP) is a research project funded by the National Institutes of Neurological Disorders and Stroke.

What Does Participation Involve?

- A blood sample and interviews
- Participation will take 2-4 hours
- You will not need to come to a research clinic
- Participants receive compensation for participation
